Dr. Azizah Y. al-Hibri Professor Emerita of Law, University of Richmond

Dr. Azizah al-Hibri, is the founder and chair of KARAMAH: Muslim Women Lawyers for Human Rights and Professor Emerita at the University of Richmond School of Law. She earned a B.A. from The American University of Beirut and a Ph.D. in Philosophy and a J.D. from the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. al-Hibri is the first Muslim woman law professor, and the first tenured one, in the United States. In 2007, she received the Virginia First Freedom Award from the Council for America's First Freedom. Dr. al-Hibri was recently appointed to the US Commission on International Religious Freedom by President Barack Obama.

Richard J. Jones, holds the Al-Alwani Chair in Muslim-Christian Studies at the Washington Theological Consortium. He is a priest of the Episcopal Church. He is the author of *How to Talk to your Muslim Neighbor* and a biography for young Muslim readers, *Jesus, Son of Mary*.
