

Taha Al-Alwani Certificate in Christian-Muslim Studies

Fourteen centuries of encounter, as well as the contemporary growth and influence of ethnically diverse Muslim communities in the U.S., make Christian-Muslim studies an important competency for today's faith leaders. Required Courses

- Introduction to Islam (for Christian students) or Christianity (for Muslim students)
 - Interreligious Dialogue
- Practical issues in Christian-Muslim Collaboration
 - · Elective in the tradition other than one's own
 - Pastoral Placement in a Muslim or interfaith institution (optional)
