Cecil M. (Mel) Robeck is Professor of Church History and Ecumenics at Fuller Theological Seminary and director of the DuPlessis Center for Christian Spirituality. Ordained with the Assemblies of God, Robeck has worked on ecumenical dialogues for nearly 30 years with the World Council of Churches, the Vatican, the World Communion of Reformed Churches, the Lausanne Committee for World Evangelization, and the Global Christian Forum. His publications focus on Ecumenics, the Holy Spirit and the Church in Pentecostal perspectives. They include *The Azusa Street Mission and Revival: The Birth of the Global Pentecostal Movement* (2006, Recipient of the *Pneuma* Award) and *Prophecy at Carthage: Perpetua, Tertullian, and Cyprian* (1992), and (co-editor) *The Suffering Body: Responding to the Persecution of Christians* (2006).
