Dr. Peter C. Phan Georgetown University

Peter Phan emigrated from Vietnam to the U.S. as a refugee in 1975. He earned the Doctor of Sacred Theology from the *Universitas Pontificia Salesiana*, Rome, and the Doctor of Philosophy and the Doctor of Divinity from the University of London. He holds the Ignacio Ellacuría Chair of Catholic Social Thought at Georgetown University. He has served as President of the Catholic Theological Society of America, and in 2010 he received the CTSA's John Courtney Murray Award.

His publications range from patristic thought to ecclesiology, mission, and culture. Dr. Phan has addressed issues of ecclesial diversity and immigration in *Christianities in Migration: The Global Perspective* (2016), *Contemporary Issues of Migration and Theology* (2013) and in many other works. He is general editor of the multi-volume *Theology in Global Perspective* (Orbis) and *Ethnic American Pastoral Spirituality* (Paulist). His work appears in eleven languages.
