
Al-Alwani Lectures in Muslim-**Christian Dialogue**

Dr. Amir Akrami has taught at the Al-Mahdi Institute in England, the Institute for Interreligious Dialogue in Iran, and is currently the visiting Luce scholar, Eastern Mennonite University. He has written on Divine Consultation, Human Nature, Justice, and Scriptural Interpretation in Islam, in dialogue with philosophy and Abrahamic faiths.

Dr. Wilhelmus Valkenberg has taught at the Catholic University of Nigmegen, the Netherlands, Loyola University in Baltimore, and is currently Professor of Religion and Culture at the Catholic University of America. His writings cover Inter-religious Hermeneutics, Muslim-Christian dialogue, and most recently World Religions in Dialogue: A Comparative Theological Approach.
